Dear New Students and Parents,

It is my pleasure to formally welcome you to College Living Experience in Denver.

Our New Parent Orientation is scheduled for **Thursday, August 8th**. At noon, we will have a luncheon at CLE for students and parents, and the **Parent Orientation is from 12:00-4:30pm**. 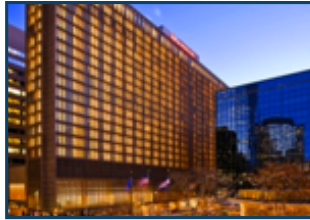
ITEMS TO BRING TO PARENT ORIENTATION
